1. This hearing has been done through hybrid mode.
2. The present petition has been filed under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of directions in relation to the alleged administrative/e-filing obstruction and non-speaking registry defects in respect of the petitioners Competition Appeal pending before the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT).
3. The petitioner, who appears in person, submits that despite repeated attempts, he has been unable to have his Competition Appeal processed on account of technical glitches and difficulties faced on the NCLAT e-filing portal. He submits that though efforts have been made to cure the defects pointed out by the Registry, the appeal has not yet been processed.
4. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents, who appears on advance notice, submits that this Court does not exercise administrative control over the NCLAT Registry. She further submits that the representations



submitted by the petitioner have already been considered and appropriate responses have been furnished to him. It is submitted that certain defects were pointed out by the Registry and the petitioner was required to remove the same. She further submits that even the requisite court fee in respect of the accompanying IA's has not been affixed and that the petitioner may approach the NCLAT Registry for any clarification regarding the filing process.

5. During the course of hearing, the petitioner admits that replies/e-mails have been received from the office of the Registrar regarding the defects raised by the Registry.
6. List the matter before the Roster Bench 27.08.2026.
7. The order be uploaded forthwith on the website.
